East of England Strategic Review of the Mount Vernon Cancer Centre

NHS England East of England Specialised Commissioning Team and NHS London are undertaking a long-term review of the Mount Vernon Cancer Centre.



The Mount Vernon Cancer Centre Programme Board met in December 2022 (first meeting since July) and discussed the proposed criteria to be used to determine the location for a networked radiotherapy unit, a proposal for Chemotherapy at Home, and investment into the Northwood site as an interim measure to bridge to the long-term relocation.

All stakeholders agreed on the criteria for networked radiotherapy, but could not reach consensus over how they should be weighted in relation to the relative importance of reducing health inequalities compared to patient access.

There is still no news about funding from the New Hospitals Programme but constructive talks have happened with the national team about other routes to capital funding and it is hoped that some sort of funding decision will be made in the next couple of months.

Despite the challenges, staff at Mount Vernon Cancer Centre continue to deliver safe and effective care to a high standard. Waiting times for treatment are amongst the best in the country.

4. Holding commissioners and providers to account and partnership working

Please note, most meetings took place virtually during the period. As in the previous quarter we now report in a slightly different format, beginning with our role around patient leadership at a strategic level, then listing meetings with commissioners and providers and summarising key themes covered.



Hertfordshire and West Essex Integrated Care System (ICS) – The implementation of the Integrated Care Board (ICB) and Integrated Care Partnership (ICP) has again been a key factor in our activity during the quarter providing further opportunities to be involved around: patient experience, service quality, equalities and diversity and the role of the Voluntary, Community, Faith and Social Enterprise (VCFSE) sector. Activity has included:

- Meeting with the Chair and Chief Executive of the System to discuss the Partnership's strategy, system challenges and our research.
- Monthly meetings with senior staff across the Integrated Care Board to raise issues from signposting and research.
- Involvement with meetings of the Integrated Care System including: the Integrated Care Partnership Board, their Primary Care Board, and Primary Care Commissioning Committee, as well as the Integrated Care Board Quality Committee.
- Our involvement around equalities work within the System and membership of the System's Inequalities Strategy Board.
- Membership of the steering group of the Integrated Care System Voluntary, Community, Faith & Social Enterprise Sector Alliance.
- Meeting with East and North Herts Trust's Research Lead to explore Integrated Care Board research opportunities (see section 3).

South and West Herts Health and Care Partnership (SWHHCP) – Our involvement with the partnership continues to be extensive. encompassing our lead role on coproduction across the partnership. During the quarter, work has included:

- Co-chairing the Care Partnership's Interim Coproduction Board (see section 3)
- Membership of the Care Partnership's Quality Group to ensure that the patient perspective is seen alongside clinical challenges.

East and North Herts Health and Care Partnership (ENHHCP) – We also have extensive involvement with the partnership in the east and north of the county. This includes:

- Membership of the Partnership Board where we represent the patient perspective
- Chairing and managing the Community Assembly, which looks at strategic issues on health and care across the area and aims to enhance opportunities for patient involvement with workstream priorities. The latest meeting included reviewing the Partnership's Strategy and the interconnectivity between mental ill health and physical ill health
- Being part of the Board's group addressing health inequalities.

Meetings with Service Providers

The meetings allow an important opportunity to raise issues from our research and signposting and the NHS and Herts County Council have been very receptive to feedback on how their services can be improved. These meetings also covered patient and community involvement,



our research on equalities, and the resulting recommendations to organisations. These meetings complement the meetings with senior commissioning staff mentioned above.

West Hertfordshire Teaching Hospitals Trust -

Our work with the Trust during the period included:

- Chairing the Trust's Coproduction Board
- Meeting with the external assessor of the 'Well Led' review of the Trust
- Plus meetings with:
 - The Trust Chair and Chief Executive to discuss strategic issues including the hospital redevelopment, service pressures and strategic priorities
 - The Director of Nursing to discuss issues from signposting and research
 - The Deputy Chief Nurse and Associate Chief Nurse to plan Coproduction Board agendas
 - Meeting the Trust's Deputy Chief Medical Officer to discuss Patient Safety Partners

East and North Herts Trust -

We held meetings in the period with:

- The Trust Chair and Chief Executive and discussed significant pressures at the Trust, equalities issues, patient involvement and transformation
- The Director of Nursing to discuss issues from signposting and research with particular concerns being about maternity services and demands on the Emergency Department
- The external assessor of the 'Well Led' review of the Trust

Princess Alexandra Hospital Trust -

We took part in the Trust's Patient Led Assessment of the Care Environment.

<u>Hertfordshire Partnership University Foundation Trust (HPFT) and The Mental Health, Learning</u> <u>Disability and Autism Health and Safety Partnership</u> -

During the quarter our contact with the Trust included:

- Our regular meeting with Trust Directors to discuss issues of strategic importance and service performance
- Regular meeting with the Director of Nursing to discuss signposting and research matters
- Meeting with the Partnership's Director to discuss strategic issues and the Community Assembly
- Meeting with the Deputy Director of Strategy to discuss the Trust's process for community, service user, and carer input into the new 5-year strategy
- Chairing and running the carers' project scrutiny group and support the Carer Essential Training Innovation Bid.

<u>Hertfordshire Community Trust</u> – our meetings with the Trust in the period included our regular meeting with the Chair and Chief Executive, which focused on service developments at the Trust. We also explored issues around pressures on the Trust and the planned industrial action.



In addition, we held our meeting with the Director of Nursing to discuss signposting issues with a particular focus on children's services.

Central London Community Healthcare Trust – we had our regular meeting with the Director of Nursing and Therapy and covered: winter pressures, (including the severe pressure across the system in the week before Christmas) quality, and transformation work being implemented in Hertfordshire.

<u>Connect Health</u> – We held our quarterly meeting with the Service Manager for services in Hertfordshire.

Hertfordshire County Council (HCC) - Adult Social Care -

During the quarter we had:

- A meeting with the Executive Director to discuss integration between social care and health, the role of Healthwatch in supporting this, and the cultural awareness of home care services
- Three meetings with commissioners regarding the new Healthwatch Hertfordshire contract and how it will be monitored
- Regular contact with the service about the closure of St Elizabeth's Care Home and new homes for the residents

Hertfordshire Safeguarding Adults Board

We took part in a peer review of the Herts Adult Safeguarding Board as part of County Council's preparation for their Care Quality Commission inspection to assure County Council that the Board is running efficiently and effectively.

The independent consultant conducting the review wanted to interview different members of the Board, including members from non-statutory organisations who have the voice of the service user in particular.

The consultant felt that we should be commissioned to do some work for the Board to ensure the patient voice is more prominent.

Hertfordshire County Council (HCC) – Public Health –

During the period our contact with Public Health included further meetings with the Drugs and Alcohol Team to discuss future partnership working and our planned research work in the spring (see section 3).

Hertfordshire County Council (HCC) – Scrutiny – we presented at the County Council's Health Scrutiny Committee on our work on ethnic health inequalities and the recommendations to the NHS.

Regional Meetings including Healthwatch England -



- We chair the Regional Network meeting of Healthwatch and held the regional meeting virtually in October.
- We are Board members of the National Institute for Health and Care Research (NIHR) Applied Research Collaboration (ARC) East of England and attended the latest meeting in November.
- We are Board members of the relevant National Institute for Health and Care Research Public Health Intervention Responsive Studies Team (PHIRST Connect) and attended the latest meeting in October.
- Meeting with Norfolk County Council about Healthwatch.

Local Councils and Voluntary and Community Sector partners – As mentioned previously, our relationship with Voluntary and Community Sector partners and District Councils has continued to develop. During this quarter our work has included:

- Work with the Integrated Care System Voluntary, Community, Faith & Social Enterprise (VCFSE) Alliance Steering Group partners including work with Herts County Council for the presentation on coproduction at the VCFSE conference and the role of the sector to support the Integrated Care Partnership's Inequalities work
- Meeting with the Anne Robson Trust to discuss End of Life Care
- Meeting with Relate, London North West and Hertfordshire to share knowledge and expertise
- Meeting with the NHS Fellowship to discuss health and care concerns

Themes discussed and issues raised in the period include:

- 'Winter' demands, unprecedented pressures, the impact of flu and Covid services
- Demands on services and capacity across all services including staffing levels and impact on service delivery (this can be general pressure, impacts of staff illness, plus specifics such as the challenge of recruiting specific qualified staff)
- Pressures on Accident and Emergency Services, situation management and linked themes such as effective patient discharge planning. This included new and differing demands such as the significant growth in children and young people's use of emergency services at East & North Herts Trust
- Support in Emergency Departments for people with mental health challenges
- Difficulties with accessing primary care (where inflexible systems remain a big issue)
- St Elizabeth's Care Home closure, impact, and management of transfer to new homes
- Situation with Maternity Services at East & North Herts Trust following the Care Quality Commission inspection in October
- Dual diagnosis services and pressures including actions being taken to address serious concerns
- Situation at Forest House, Forest House Child & Adolescent Mental Health Service provision and reinspection
- Further discussions on actions to address issues identified in our unequal treatment work



- Cost of living impact on patients and staff and whether services are addressing this issue in how services are provided
- The Integrated Care System progress and challenges
- New hospital developments, current situation, and continued opportunities for patient involvement
- Feedback from signposting including delays to treatment, lack of patient involvement and ineffective communication, and the effectiveness of interfaces between primary and secondary care
- Support for carers when a family member is in a psychiatric ward, action plans for carers, and discharge from psychiatric wards

NHS Dental Services

We presented the work we have done on dentistry 'Using Expert Patients to advise practices on improvements' at the NHS England/Improvement East of England Community Conversations Health Inequalities and Oral Health Webinar in October.

Herts & West Essex System Quality Group

We presented the findings from our research 'Making Local Healthcare Equal: Healthcare Concerns in Black and Asian Communities' to the group. We co-presented with the Integrated Care Board's Associate Director for Quality Assurance and Performance Improvement who provided an update on what they were doing in response to our recommendations.
