Central London Community Healthcare NHS Trust

CLCH (Central London Community Healthcare NHS Trust)

Provider of a variety of Adult Community Services in the west of the county under Herts Valleys CCG. Their services include district nursing, discharge, rehabilitation, podiatry, and many more.



East of England Ambulance Service NHS Trust (EEAST)

Provide a 24 hour, 365 days a year accident and emergency services to those in need of emergency medical treatment and transport in - Bedfordshire, Hertfordshire, Essex, Norfolk, Suffolk and Cambridgeshire. They also provide non-emergency patient transport in the abovementioned areas.

Hertfordshire County Council (HCC)

Hertfordshire County Council is the upper-tier local authority for the non-metropolitan county of Hertfordshire, in England, the United Kingdom. It is responsible for Adult Social Care (ACS) and Children's Social Care Services and Public Health.

Hertfordshire Community NHS Trust (HCT)



Provides a variety of health care in the community for children across the county and adults in east and north Hertfordshire, including such treatments as wound care (via ICTs), speech therapy and physiotherapy. They have a number of clinics across Hertfordshire that services are based in, as well as offering home visits to those in need.



HertsHelp

A network of community organisations in Hertfordshire working together. Their aim is to listen and help clients find independent support, guidance and information.







Hertfordshire Partnership University NHS Foundation Trust (HPFT)

Provide health and social care for adults and children with mental ill health, physical ill health, and learning disabilities, all across Hertfordshire.

Also provide a Single Point of Access (SPA) which can be called in a crisis as well as allows people to simply enter the Mental Health system.

Herts & West Essex Integrated Care System (ICS)

At local level, Health and Care Partnerships cover the areas previously covered by the Clinical Commissioning Groups (see above) and discuss operational matters. Sitting above these, there is the Herts & West Essex-wide Integrated Care Partnership (ICP) which brings together partners at a strategic level to work together to plan and deliver services. There is also the Integrated Care Board (ICB), which deals with matters such as terms and conditions, service quality, etc; their aim is to take a more cohesive, collaborative approach to looking after the health of the local population across the NHS and local authorities.

These three bodies make up the ICS, which is overall responsible for managing resources, maintaining NHS standards, and improving the health of the local population.

Local Government & Social Care OMBUDSMAN

Local Government & Social Care Ombudsman (LGO)

Makes final decisions on complaints about councils, all adult social care providers (including



care homes and home care agencies) and some other organisations providing local public services.

NHS England (NHSE)



NHS England is an executive non-departmental public body of the Department of Health and Social Care.

NHS England oversees the budget, planning, delivery and day-to-day operation of the commissioning side of the NHS in England.

NHS Improvement (NHSI)



Responsible for overseeing foundation trusts and NHS trusts, as well as independent providers that provide NHS-funded care. It supports providers to give patients consistently safe, high quality, compassionate care within local health systems that are financially sustainable.

Since 2019, NHS England and NHS Improvement have worked together as a single organisation in the management of England's National Health Service.

NHS Business Services Authority (NHSBSA)



The NHSBSA is responsible for overseeing the charging of services in the NHS where patients have to pay (e.g. prescriptions, dental care) unless the patient is exempt. The BSA is also responsible for verifying exemptions and reductions on chargeable NHS care/treatment claimed by patients (e.g. Low Income Scheme, maternity exemptions).



Parliamentary and Health Service Ombudsman (PHSO)



Makes final decisions on complaints that have not been resolved by the NHS in England and UK government departments and other public organisations.

Patient Advice and Liaison Service (PALS)



Every NHS Trust has a PALS, which is usually located within the hospital. They provide advice and support to NHS patients and their relatives and carers.

Patient Participation Group (PPG)

Designed to offer patients an opportunity to be involved with and support their local General Practice.

POhWER



A charity that provides information, advocacy and advice services across Hertfordshire, offering direct and local support via professionals and volunteers. This service is accessed via HertsHelp.

Hertfordshire Safeguarding: Adults Board (HSAB) & Children's Partnership (HSCP)



The HSAB and HSCP are partnerships working with organisations to make sure children & adults at risk are cared for somewhere free from abuse and harassment, in their daily lives. These sit across several organisations such as HCC, HPFT, and the police.
